Degree Requirements

Seventy-three (73) credits are required for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in Global Affairs, fifty-two (52) of which must be completed as coursework.

All students must complete:

- One (1) Foundation Course: *Evolution of the Global System* [**3 credits**]
- One (1) Dissertation Preparation course: *Doctoral Seminar on Theory and Methods* [**3 credits**]
- Two Capstone Colloquia Series with grades of Pass [**4 credits**]
- Two (2) Research and Methodology courses [**6 credits**]
- Five (5) Course Electives [**15 credits**]
- Dissertation Research [**21 credits**] – *to be completed following the 52-credit review*
- Language Requirement [**no credit**]

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

- **Areas of Inquiry** [21 credits]

Students must complete seven (7) of the eight AI courses with grades of B (3.0) or higher in each course to remain in the program. Students who do not receive a grade of B or higher in any AI course must retake the course.

All AI requirements must be completed in residence. Transfer credits may not be used in fulfillment of AI requirements.
