Degree Requirements

Seventy-three (73) credits are required for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in Global Affairs. All students must complete:

- Six Core Courses with grades of B (3.0) or higher (18 credits)
- Two Semesters of the Colloquium with grades of Pass (4 Credits)
- Two methodology course (6 credits)
- Four courses in a concentration (12 credits)
- Four additional or elective courses (12 credits)
- Language requirement

Students must maintain a grade point average of 3.50 or higher in all non-language courses taken at Rutgers University, in order to acquire the Ph.D.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

- **Core Courses** (18 credits)

Students must complete all six Core Courses with a grade of B (3.0) or higher in each in order to remain in the program. Students who do not receive a grade of B or higher in some Core Course must either retake it or take another Core Course. All core requirements must be completed at the DGA. Transfer credits may not be used in fulfillment of core requirements.
