## Logs

Logs are due Wednesday at Midnight, the day before class. These are typewritten diaries that reflect on your internship experiences and the reading assignment for that week. Logs are single-spaced and must fill an entire page (with regular 1” margins). They must also be written in the 1<sup>st</sup> person, with nearly every sentence containing ‘I’, ‘me’, ‘myself’.

## Evaluations

I assume that everyone with an internship will receive an ‘A’ grade.

To do so, you must:

- complete your internship hours (98 minimum), be punctual about the hours you have promised to keep, and carry out your duties responsibly,
- attend every meeting of the Internship course,
- come to class fully prepared; e.g. with the assigned reading completed,
- participate in class discussions,
- turn in your logs on time.

Do all this, and you are guaranteed an ‘A’. Fail to do one or more parts of this, however, and your grade will decline precipitously.
